Don't like crowds?

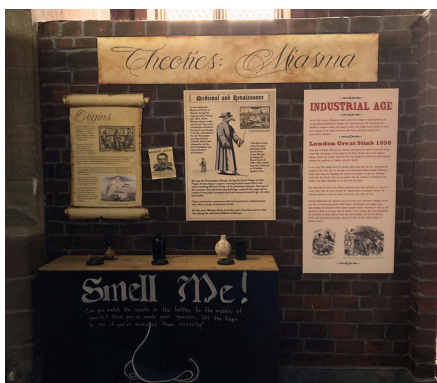
Weekdays are quieter, or weekend mornings before 1pm. Our busiest times are 1-3pm on weekends

Interaction

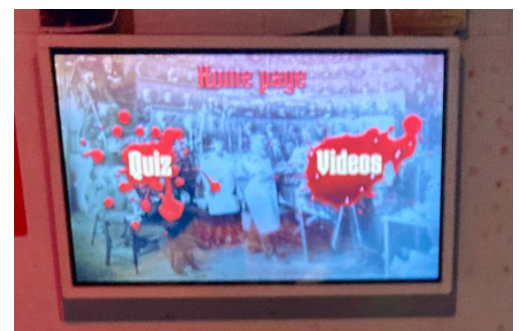
You will find plenty of fun, interactive games and activities...

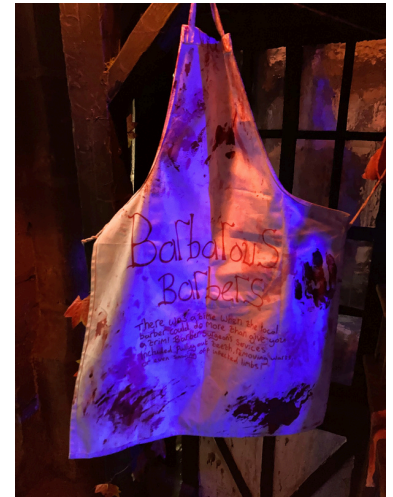


Go through this door...

Theories of Medicine

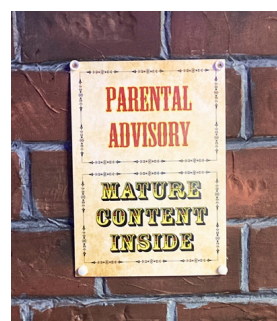


A well-lit area with plenty to read, open and do. You can smell strong odours (but only if you wish)

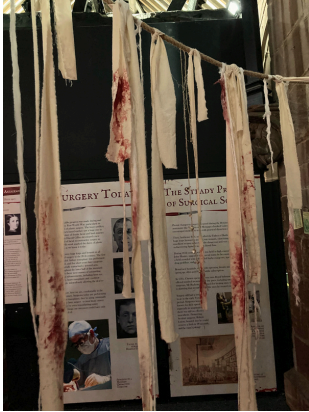
You can hear the spooky music throughout the exhibition, but by now it is only quietly in the background
